7 – 8:15 p.m.

Take Care of Your Planet – Achievement 6

If you recycle, plant trees or turn off electrical appliances that are not in use, you are taking care of our planet. Want to do more? Discover where our trash goes after it is hauled away. Identify how water is used, or misused, in your home. Study what kinds of energy your house uses and how electricity is made to power Northeast Ohio.

Forester Activity Badge

Tuesday, September 28, 2010

7 – 8:15 p.m.

Identify trees and plants on a hike through Huntington Reservation. Explore the components of a tree, their functions, and the ways people and animals use these plants. Examine the growth rings of a tree to interpret its life history. Learn the benefits and harm that wildfires cause a forest ecosystem. Draw an urban forestry plan for your yard or neighborhood. *Please dress for a hike in any weather!*



Geologist Activity Badge

Tuesday, October 26, 2010

7 – 8:15 p.m.

Explore the three main types of rocks, how they are formed, and the ways they are useful in our homes and daily lives. Examine five geologic specimens and study the formation of a volcano. Hike to Porter Creek and check out our local geology, look for fossils and begin a rock collection, including a sample of our state gemstone. *Please dress for a hike in the weather!*

Naturalist Activity Badge

Tuesday, November 30, 2010

7 – 8:15 p.m.

Become a naturalist, study our resident animals and learn to identify local birds, snakes and mammals. Learn how litter can harm animals and take that information back to your neighborhood to correct hazards. Identify a bird flyway, learn which birds use them, and build a bird feeder. Learn to identify poisonous plants and venomous reptiles in our area.

Cub Scout Registration Information & Program Notes

- Sign up as a den/pack or as an individual scout! Individual scouts must have an adult in attendance.
- Pre-registration required for all programs and is taken on a first-come, first-served basis. Space is limited.
- Fees: \$8/Scout; Full payment is due at time of registration. Payment may be made by check (payable to LENS), cash or Visa/MasterCard/Discover.
- We ask that you please register at least 2 weeks ahead for programs.

- Age-appropriate activities are designed for program participants only; ***no siblings or other non-scouts please. You are welcome to enjoy the Center exhibits, but for the safety, concentration and enjoyment of the scouts, we cannot permit parents to bring young children or strollers into the classrooms.***
- The time listed on your confirmation is the ***starting time*** for the program. Arrive 15 minutes early for check-in. If your start time is delayed, the program will conclude at the scheduled time, which may not allow for completion of the requirements.
- For the sake of our animals, we ask that you do not bring food or drink to any program without advance approval or unless specified in the program description.
