Registration: Member Registration begins online Monday, January 27 at 9:00 a.m. Open registration begins online Monday, February 3 at 9:00 a.m. You must sign in to your User Account to receive your automatic member discounts.

Fees: Payment can be made by cash, check, credit or debit card (Visa, MasterCard, American Express or Discover). A \$30 fee will be applied to any returned checks.

Member Rates: We offer discounted rates for those who are active Members of Lake Erie Nature & Science Center. In order to receive the discount, your membership must be active for the duration of the program or school year.

Refunds: Notification is required one week prior to the start of the class or program to be eligible for a refund. A service fee of \$5 or 5% (whichever is greater) will be assessed.

Missed Classes: We are unable to issue refunds for missed classes. In order to maintain classroom continuity, we do not provide make-up classes.

Cancellations: If classes are cancelled or the Center is closed, we will update our website and social media pages. In inclement weather, we cancel classes in line with the Bay Village School District.


