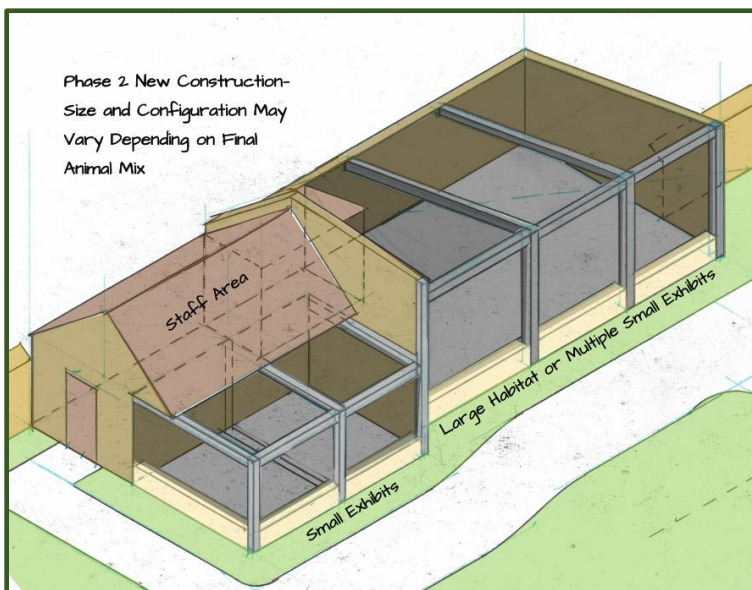

Mammal Exhibit

The Mammal Exhibit will be the primary feature of Phase 2 of this Project and will be located adjacent to the Aviary. Offering visitors up-close views of native mammals such as fox, raccoon, opossum, or skunk the Mammal Exhibit expands on connections with species found in our local landscape. Many of these animals are former rehabilitation patients that cannot be released and have become residents of the Nature Center as animal ambassadors. Ginny the Opossum and Ellie the Skunk are often interpreted in the Wonders of Wildlife family program and have become favorites among young children.





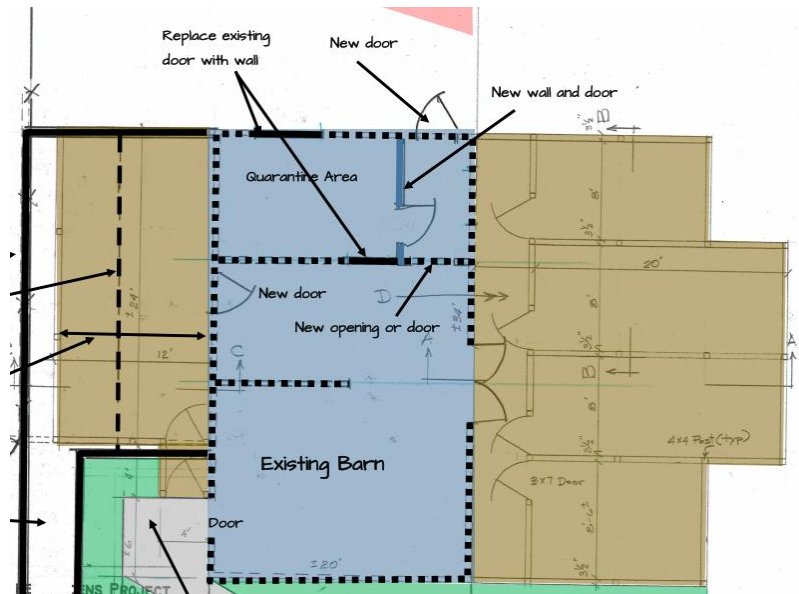
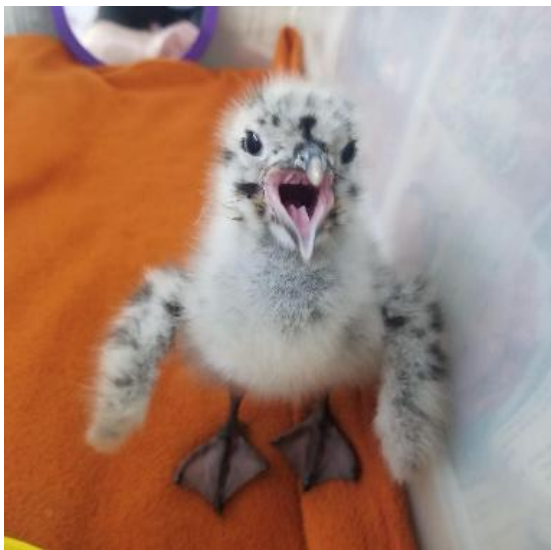

Wildlife Quarantine Area

Named sponsorship available for a contribution of \$100,000 – Sponsorship pending

The Nature Center continues to build on its high standards of wildlife rehabilitation as demonstrated with the first phase of renovations. A Wildlife Quarantine Area will be created inside and adjacent to the wildlife barn to provide additional safeguards for the health of rehabilitation patients, personnel, resident animals, and the visiting public. The Quarantine Area will support current quarantine procedures for avian species such as screening new arrivals, monitoring patients, use of appropriate equipment, and important protocols for wildlife care. The Nature Center is setting high standards of care and exceeding industry guidelines with these structural advancements while ensuring safe, high-quality treatment for ill and injured animals. This area will prepare our wildlife rehabilitation program for success in the future, in the midst of evolving zoonotic diseases.

Garden Benches

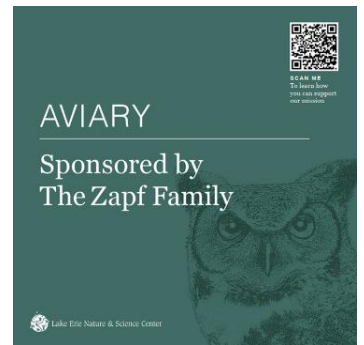
Naming opportunities available for a contribution of \$10,000
